Third, the Unit 502 games continue on the first and third Sunday of each month at the EBCBC beginning at 1:00 pm. As a reminder, if you "scratch," these games provide





Club Championship level masterpoint awards. At the March 20, 2022 Unit 502 Board Meeting, the Board voted to increase table fees to \$10.00 per person to match the EBCBC fee schedule. The increased fees became effective at the April 3, 2022 Unit Game.

Fourth, the ever-popular Tunnel Tournament competition for “bragging rights” between Units 499 and 502 resumes (after a two-year hiatus) on Sunday, October 23, 2022 at the East Bay Community Bridge Center on Oakland. This is a two-session game, and there will be Open level competition in A, B and C strats plus a separate 299er game. Marin By Arti Bhargava (508)

Greetings all! As of July, we have a few new Marin Board members: Cindy Blum, Shirley Ehrlich, Vince Mueller, and Arti Bhargava. Arti was elected to be our new President, and Anne Schweichler our VP. We haven't sorted out all the positions on the Board yet but hope to do so during the next Board meeting. As with other units, we are concerned about growing our F2F games, and we sent out an online survey to help figure out what our unit members have to say. Melanie Haddad (our secretary and generally awesome Board member) composed and sent out the survey, and the summary of the results is as follows (about 20% of our membership responded):

- 1) 49% of our respondents have returned to F2F bridge
- 2) Almost 95% of our respondents not playing in the F2F games are open to returning to live games
- 3) 83% of the respondents are currently playing on BBO
- 4) We were asked by the District if STaC games would entice more F2F bridge, and we got a very lukewarm response as to the popularity of additional STaC games.





- 5) The majority of respondents who have not returned to F2F bridge cited the risk of contracting Covid. The next most cited reason was the convenience, flexibility and cost of BBO games.
- 6) The majority of respondents who have returned to F2F bridge cited the social component of live bridge, and because all live players are vaccinated, they felt safe and comfortable playing in the clubs.
- 7) In terms of making F2F games more attractive, there were many comments, and a few of the more commonly mentioned suggestions are: more beginner classes and games; financial incentives (like attend 3 games and the 4th game is free); bring back food and coffee.

Onto other news: A few Marin bridge players did exceedingly well at the Boise regional August 1-7. A huge congratulations to Carol Liss and her partner Val Kovachev who were the top overall master point winners. Arti Bhargava and her partner Mitch Dunitz won every event they entered save one where they only managed second. Returning Marin bridge player William Bailey and his partner Josh Donn finished in the top 5 of all master point winners. The participants found Boise to be a charming small city, with excellent restaurants. Coincidentally the New York Times published an article the week they were there which listed Boise as the fastest growing metropolitan area in the country.
