Mark your calendars so you don't miss attending the East Bay Fall Sectional on



November 16th and 17th (Saturday & Sunday). We'll be playing again at the terrific Mastick Senior Center at 1155 Santa Clara Avenue in Alameda where we've been hosted several years earlier. If you've played before at that location you'll recall it's got ample free parking, easy access, spacious playing area, and the usual "East Bay amenities" including free coffee, tea, water, snacks, nibbles, and all the rest.

Sessions start at 10:00 am with a lunch break before the afternoon game at 2:30 pm. And you won't have to leave the location to find a place for lunch because your Unit 502 volunteers have arranged for a delivered lunch of your choice of deluxe sandwich, chips, cookie, and beverage for \$12 from a local provider. These have proven very popular in past tournaments and we're keeping the same affordable price this time, too.

Here's one new twist...and PAY ATTENTION 99er PAIRS!

We're holding a special 0-99 game on Saturday (Nov. 16th 10:00 am) for all newcomers at the discount price of \$5 per player, whether or not you're a member of the ACBL [but we hope you are so you can amass those lucrative masterpoints on your record]. This special game is targeted towards the many players involved in the EBCBC mentoring games held at the bridge center. It's time to get your feet wet playing in a real, live tournament setting to see what fun and enjoyment it holds to compete with people at your own level at a price that's more than affordable. You won't have to face any players with more than 99 masterpoints, so all the "pros" and "experts" whom you want to avoid won't get in your way. This is an event tailored especially for you and I hope you'll show up on Saturday with your partner to have the time of your life showing your peers how to conquer the game of bridge.

Our Sunday schedule holds the classic "Barbara Harmon Bracketed Teams" game where your Swiss team of four players will compete with others in your relative equal masterpoint bracket. Sessions run at 10:00 am and 2:30 pm with a lunch break in between. You must play both sessions. Fees are \$15 per player per session, with a surcharge of \$4 for unpaid ACBL members who compete.


